# BETTING GUIDE - GRADED STAKES SCHEDULE

As well as being a great destination, Del Mar will host some of the country's best horses. And with the seaside track hosting the Breeders' Cup for the first time this year, the summer meet also gives potential Breeders' Cup contenders extra experience for the most important racedays of the fall.

The season begins with a bang with the San Diego Handicap (G2) July 22. This race has been growing in stature, and last year it was won by California Chrome after a stirring battle with Dortmund. This year it is set to feature the return of the world's highest-rated horse, Arrogate, who has won seven straight. The San Diego Handicap will be his first start since a stirring victory in the Dubai World Cup at the end of March.

The San Diego Handicap is the most important lead-up to the richest and most prestigious race of the meet, the \$1 million **Pacific Classic (G1)** at 1 1/4 miles Aug. 19. In the past two years it has been won by champions California Chrome and Beholder, and it is a likely target for Arrogate.

The first Grade I races at Del Mar come at the end of July. The six furlong **Bing Crosby Stakes**, one of California's biggest sprints, is on Saturday, July 29, and the next day features the **Clement L. Hirsch Stakes**. One of California's premier races for fillies and mares, the Clement L. Hirsch was won three times by Zenyatta last decade, and its last two editions were won by Beholder and Stellar Wind.

Del Mar also hosts the first Grade I races in California for 2-year-olds, the **Del Mar Debutante** for fillies Sept. 2 and **Del Mar Futurity** the following day. Futurity winners in recent years include Nyquist and American Pharoah, while champion filly Songbird won the Debutante two years ago. Both races are at seven furlongs, and the juveniles get important leadups in the **Sorrento Stakes (G2)** for fillies Aug 5, and the **Best Pal Stakes (G2)** Aug. 12.

The Del Mar turf hosts nine graded stakes races. The most important is the **Del Mar Oaks (G1)** on Pacific Classic Day, Aug 19. Run over 1 1/8 miles, this attracts many of the best 3-year-old turf fillies in the country. Colts and geldings get their chance in the **Del Mar Derby (G2)** Sept. 3.

Also significant on the turf are two races for turf milers, the Eddie Read Stakes (G2) July 22 and the Del Mar Mile (G2) Aug 20. Midnight Storm won both races last year prior to finishing third in the Breeders' Cup Mile. Fillies and mares are also well catered for on turf, with the Yellow Ribbon Handicap (G2) Aug. 5 and the John C. Mabee Stakes (G2) Sept. 2, while the stayers get their chance in the 1 3/8 mile Del Mar Handicap (G2) Aug. 19.

With these and several other top races, Del Mar will keep players interested throughout the meet.





# JUVENILE STARS COME OUT AT DEL MAR

Del Mar is known for 2-year-old racing, with juvenile champions American Pharoah, Songbird, Nyquist and Champagne Room competing at the seaside oval during the last three summer sessions, and the 2017 meet holds added significance with the Breeders' Cup making its first appearance at the track this fall.

Many exciting prospects will be unveiled over the next seven weeks and a pair of centerpiece events, the Del Mar Futurity (G1) on September 4 and Del Mar Debutante (G1) two days earlier, are offered at the conclusion of the meet.

Here is a preview of 2-year-olds with racing experience who may be pointing toward Del Mar, listed by trainer:

#### **Bob Baffert**

No race is more deserving of Bob Baffert's namesake than the Del Mar Futurity. The Hall of Fame trainer has posted a remarkable 13 wins in the important 7-furlong test, including victories by Triple Crown hero American Pharoah and Hall of Famer Silver Charm, and he has 35 horses nominated to the 2017 edition. Along with 24 nominees to the Debutante, Baffert could have more than 50 2-year-olds in action at Del Mar. Here are a few prominent runners who have started:

**DIAMONDSANDPEARLS**: With \$1.7 million price tag, Congrats filly brought lofty expectations into debut and didn't disappoint, rolling to 6 ¼-length maiden tally at Santa Anita in early June. August 5 Sorrento (G3) up next.

**SERENGETI**: By Algorithms, front-running colt blitzed foes posting 11-length maiden second-time out in late June. August 12 Best Pal (G2) likely target but also nominated to July 22 Sanford (G2) at Saratoga.

**ZULFIKHAR**: Romped making initial appearance at Los Alamitos on July 7, drawing off to 3 ¾-length decision. \$750,000 Bodemeister colt headed to Best Pal.

# Doug O'Neill

Both of Doug O'Neill's Kentucky Derby winners, I'll Have Another and Nyquist, raced at Del Mar as juveniles and accomplished conditioner is expected to feature another deep roster of 2-year-olds this year.

**HONEYMOONZ OVER**: Second to Run Away and third to Serengeti, Congrats ridgling appears poised to graduate if he remains in maiden company.

**SAUDI CHROMA**: California-bred daughter of Lucky Pulpit drew off to smart 3 ¼-length tally when debuting in late May.

**TYFOSHA**: Gray filly bet down to 1-2 in debut but wound up a clear second to Surrender Now, who came back to win Landaluce by eight lengths. By Flatter, Tyfosha shows recent 6-furlong bullet work for second start.

#### **Jeff Bonde**

**ISMELUCKY**: After a runner-up effort, Lucky Pulpit filly rolled to easy win over open rivals when making second start at Santa Anita in mid-May.

#### Simon Callaghan

**RUN AWAY:** Bet down to odds-on in a pair of starts, Run Away and Hide colt has displayed high speed while easily defeating foes on the front end, most recently annexing the July 3 Santa Anita Juvenile by a 1 ½-length margin. Best Pal figures to be on his agenda.

# Michael Machowsky

**RUNAWAY GHOST**: After just missing versus Argosy Fleet, front-running Ghostzapper colt drew off to sharp maiden tally the second-time out at Santa Anita in June.

# Alfredo Marquez

**BIG BOY CANDY**: Twirling Candy colt rolled to an 8 ¼-length debut win and exits a third in the Santa Anita Juvenile.

#### Peter Miller

**SURRENDER NOW**: From the first crop of Morning Line, speedy filly displayed a dynamic turn of foot drawing away to eightlength score in July 2 Landaluce. Sorrento is next.

# Kristin Mulhall

**SIR VALENTINE**: Made short work of state-bred foes at Santa Anita in May and Heat Shield colt shows fast series of works in preparation for stakes bow.

# **Gary Sherlock**

**EMPRESS OF LOV**: Convincing maiden winner two back, Empire Way filly exits a fourth in Landaluce. Eligible to be a major factor in California-bred stakes.

#### **Eddie Truman**

**ARGOSY FLEET**: A game debut winner in May, Mineshaft colt exits runner-up finish in Santa Anita Juvenile.





# HANDICAPPING DEL MAR WITH BRIS ALL-WAYS DATA

If there's one race type you want to pay attention to this summer at Del Mar when using Brisnet.com Past Performances, let it be turf sprints.

Unfortunately, turf sprints have made up less than 10% of all races since 2012, so a half dozen such races per week seems to be the absolute max, but the proprietary data found in Brisnet PPs such as Speed Ratings and Prime Power performs well in these types of races, so you should make the most of these opportunities.

Since 2012, there have been 119 turf sprints at Del Mar. The top-ranked horse by last-out Speed Rating has won "only" 28% of those races, but the return on investment is a robust +22.5%. Another positive ROI category among the top-ranked horses is Quirin Points, which supports handicapper Scott Shapiro's thought that when in doubt in these turf sprints, take the horse who's likely to make the lead. The top-ranked Quirin horse wins "only" 27% of the time, but the ROI is an even more robust 46.5%.

Prime Power is better for landing on standouts than action plays. The top-ranked horse by Prime Power in turf sprints wins just 23% of the time and is overbet with an ROI of

-17%. However, when the edge is at least 7 points the win percentage balloons to 32% with a +1% ROI.

The big Prime Power gaps are powerful across all race types. In dirt sprints, it's 54% winners when the gap is at least seven, however, the ROI is -2%. This is beating the wagering public, but it does mean these horses get crushed. Better as singles in multi-race wagers than win candidates.

Dirt and turf routes fare better in the ROI category with more than 50% winners AND a positive ROI with a gap of at least 6 points.


In 2,131 races at Del Mar since 2012, the best last-out Brisnet.com Speed Rating has won 25% while the top Prime Power is at 26%. These numbers suggest that favorites could be more vulnerable here than at most tracks. Of course, they win their fair share, but if a horse is close in ability to the favorite, it appears more lucrative to take the longer price.





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
